

Lisbon was the first European Capital adopting the Participatory Budget (PB), and this experience is referred to as an innovative example by the UN


PB is a **tool for citizen participation** with the goal of **supporting decision** making processes in all the fields of competence of the city, through on line media









A new IT reference architecture for the smart city
