

The analysis found that more than **71,000 people** were at risk of losing their homes and property.

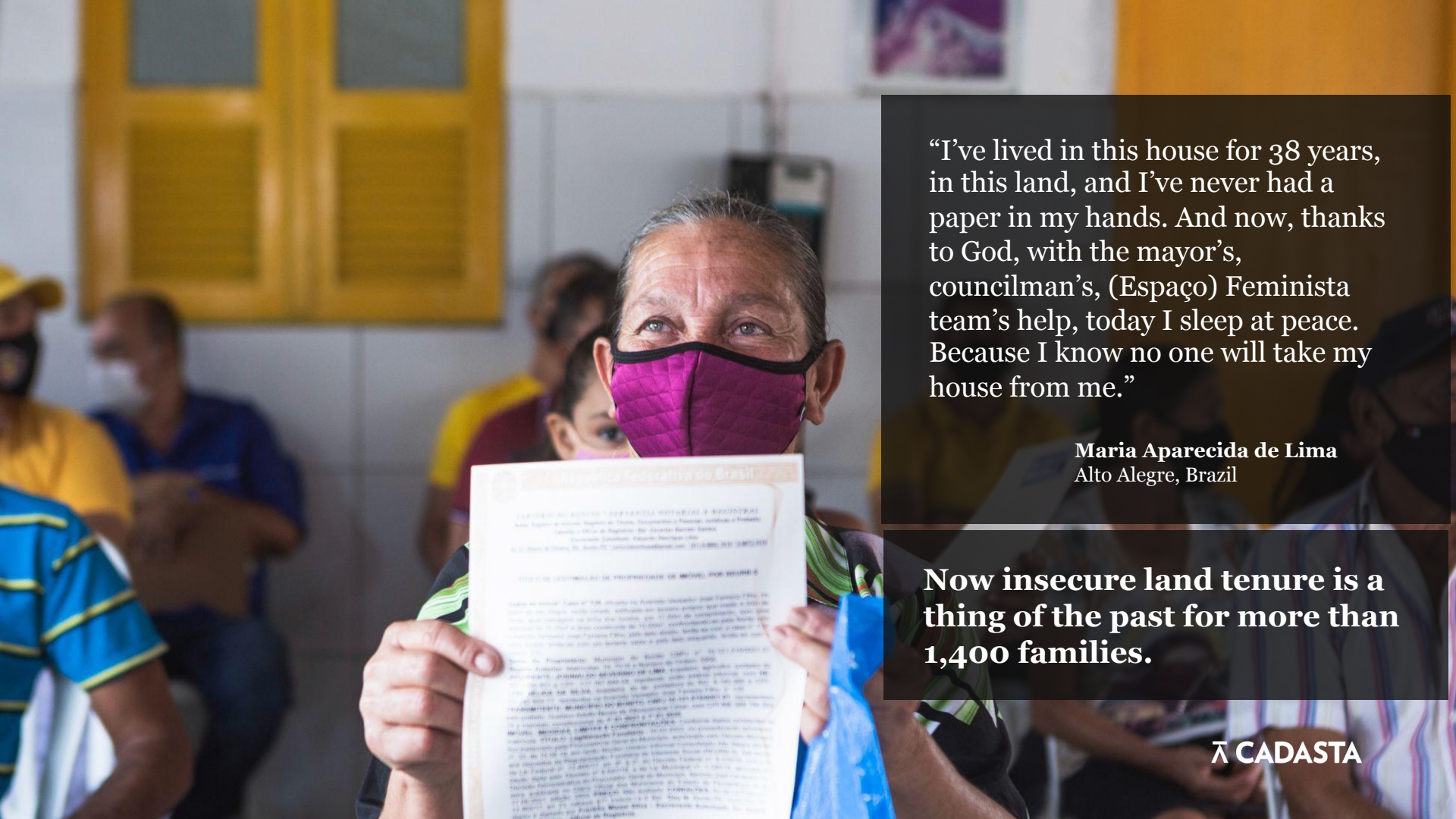
