

The analysis found that more than **71,000 people** were at risk of losing their homes and property.

"The ability for the community to see the information mapped out increases the buy-in and resilience of the potentially affected persons to work together in the advocacy work. It helps to display the mapped information and clears false community assumptions about being too far from the affected areas. It also provides an opportunity to negotiate with relevant authorities using real-time evidence."
