# How is INSPIRE doing in DK?

- It was "easy" with annex 1 (and 2)
- INSPIRE is "politically" embedded
- Moving to annex 3 is a different story
- We are on track and have a good dialogue with the data owners
- To make it happen on a big scale  
.....what's in for me?!



# Main goals right now



- Must create value for data owners
  - We have been very conceptual
  - Now we need to go useable
- Local value – no big leaver use case!
- Getting services fine tuned
- Adjust metadata
- Start harmonization process....

# New common public digitization strategy 2016-2020

- Public sector efficient and creates value and growth for citizen and enterprises – user!!
  - Automation of administrative processes
  - Improved user experiences
  - Digital welfare
  - Data sharing
  - Framework for a coherent/interoperable eGovernment
  - Data security
  - It-infrastructure solutions
  - Governance

- Digitization is more than IT solutions

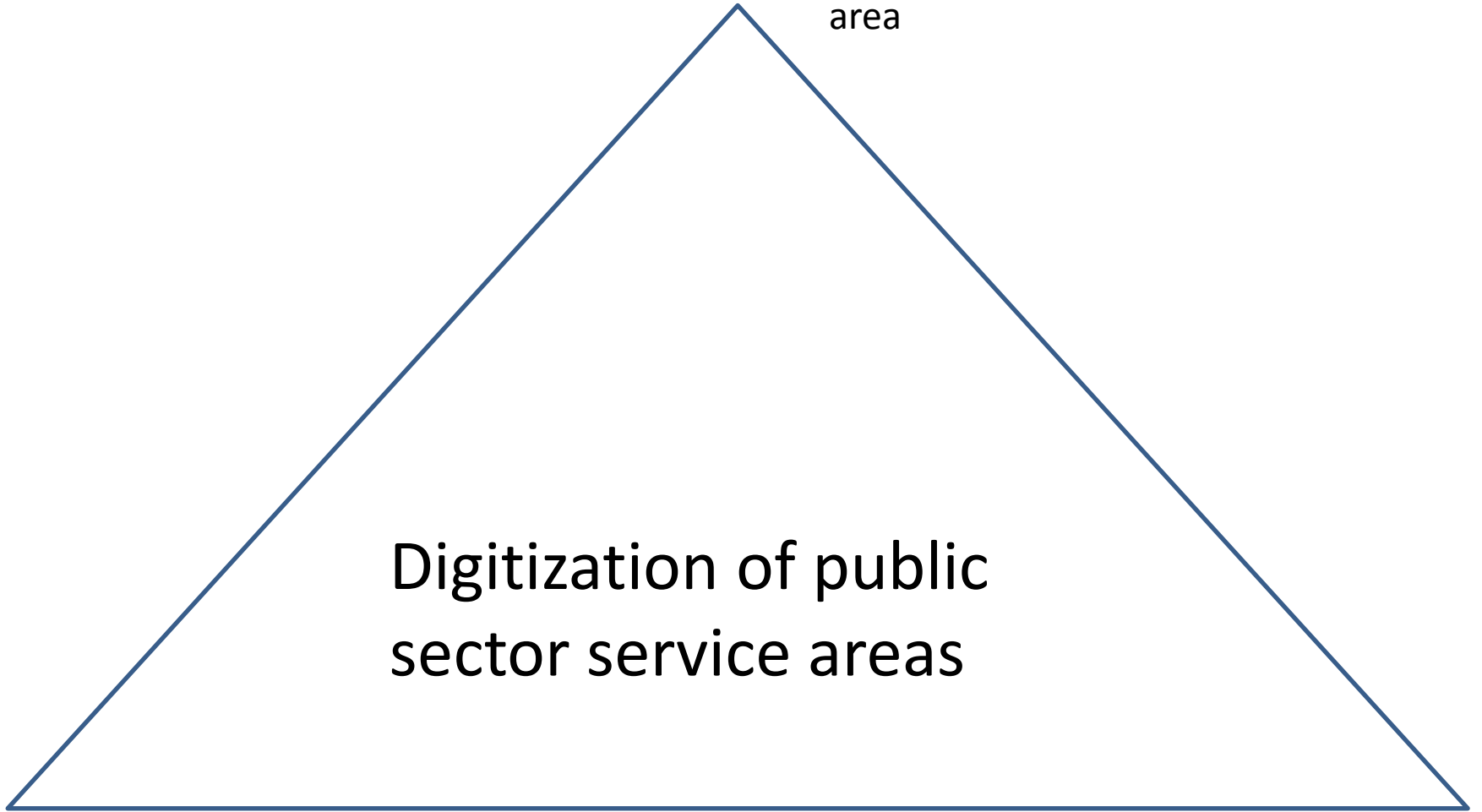

# Realize the full potential

- Data driven public management
  - the tight link between regulation and data
- Regulations that hinders digitization....
  - Data that are not adequate....
  - Processes that cannot be digitized....
- Mapping 16 legislative areas
  - Planning, forestry, waste.....
- Deep dives into 3-5 specific areas

# And INSPIRE?

- Authoritative data
  - what do we mean?
  - what properties must data have?
  - how shall regulation be designed?
  - The big question:
